Obituary

BARBARA DEVORE SPENCER APPEL was born on August 30, 1950 in Fort Valley, GA to her mother Dorothy Amey (nee Roziere). Until the age of 12 she was raised in Fort Valley, GA by her great grandmother Mary Jordan, and grand aunts, Lilly Johnson, and Lettie Craig. At the age of 12 her mother married James D. Spencer and Barbara along with her older brother Richard moved to New York, NY.

Barbara was enrolled at the newly built Louis D. Brandeis High School on New York's Upper Westside and graduated 1968. Barbara began working as a model and subsequently, as an airline flight attendant for Eastern Airlines.

Around this time, Barbara began dating Benny Cole. She suffered a tragic car accident in 1972 and became paraplegic. However, this did not deter Barbara in any way. She began rehab as NYU Rusk Rehabilitation and completed the program. She married Benny Cole and with his assistance began studying jewelry design. Soon after she opened her business in New York's affluent Diamond District on 47th Street called Cojo Creations in Fine Jewelry, Inc. Barbara enjoyed a successful career in making custom designed pieces of jewelry to many satisfied customers for over 25 years. Her youngest brother Christopher would assist her from time to time in her jewelry business with small tasks. Barbara occasionally would teach a workshop on jewelry design for the City University of New York – Fashion Institute of Technology.

During the early 1980s Barbara divorced her husband and moved to Guttenberg, NJ. In the mid 1980s, through an acquaintance, Barbara met Barry Appel, a well-known stock broker and Senior Floor Governor of the American Stock Exchange. They married in the 1986 in a private ceremony. In December of 1999, Barbara was struck with a staph infection that destroyed her eyesight. Once again, this did not deter her. With the assistance of her husband Barry and the NJ Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired, Barbara learned how to live her life comfortably.

Barbara's beloved husband Barry passed away in November of 2015. Yet Barbara continued to thrive. She was diagnosed with bladder cancer in 2021, yet she still continued to fight on. Barbara passed from this life on January 4, 2024.

Barbara is survived by her "father" James D. Spencer, brothers, Richard DeVore (Jackie), and Christopher J. Spencer, nieces Yolanda D. DeVore and Rhonda D. DeVore-Jones (Brian), grand niece Addison Jones and a host of cousins, other family and friends.
