DOROTHY MAE TOLIVER was daughter of the late Cleopatra and James Andrew Toliver Jr., was born April 12, 1947 in Harlem Hospital, New York City. She was named after her mother's long time friend and beautician. She was the third of four children.

Dorothy was delivered from all her earthly woes, no more pain and suffering on October 3, 2024. As a teenager Dorothy accepted Jesus Christ into her life and joined Second Southern Baptist Church in the Bronx. She loved singing in the choir with her two sisters praising Jesus for his many blessings.

Growing up in Harlem and the South Bronx Dorothy's educational journey began in New York City public schools. She graduated from William Howard Taft High School in the Bronx with an academic diploma (1964). Her higher education was completed at Harlem Hospital School of Nursing where she received her registered nursing diploma, RN in 1967.

Dorothy had a love for traveling, shopping and fashion and became known as the best dressed nurse wherever she was employed. Her career in nursing began at Harlem Hospital, pediatrics unit. After marrying and later divorcing Ronald Coleman the highlight of her life was having her daughter Monique from that union. Upon leaving Harlem Hospital (1970) her career continued at the prestigious Flower and Fifth Avenue Hospital which in 1984 was renamed Terrence Cardinal Cooke Health Care Center where she worked until retiring in April 2009.

"Miss T" as she was lovingly called by patients/residents, family and colleagues because of her dedication, compassionate care and leadership strength in the various units worked: the developmentally disabled, the elderly and people with Huntington's Disease became a well-respected team member at the facility. Her most fulfilling and rewarding work resulted from being head nurse (1HN) for decades on the Huntington's Disease unit at Cooke Center which officially opened in 1992 and was the only one of its kind in New York State. At the time of her retirement someone stated "Dorothy served as the bedrock of Nursing care to the HD unit since its inception. To say she will be missed is a gross understatement."

She also leaves behind three special devoted friends who she considered her family: Barbara Castro Bronx, NY, Leah Robinson Queens, NY and Flori Luna and daughters of the Bronx, NY and a host of cousins and faithful friends.
