Dr. Carol L. Matthew passed away peacefully on July 19, 2024, in Atlanta. The family matriarch was born on January 17, 1932, in Baltimore, Maryland. She was the second child of Dr. Edward S. Lewis and Mary M. Lewis. Her father, an Urban League executive, moved the family from Morgan Park Maryland to Harlem, New York. Carol attended Music and Art High School and earned a B.A in Child Study at Sarah Lawrence College. She began her master's degree in social work at Columbia University and completed her MSW at Simmons College, in Boston.

Carol married Dr. Thomas William Matthew, who was training in neurological surgery at Boston Veterans Medical Center. To this union five children were born: Laura Jean, Thomas Lewis, Diane Alison, Edward Alan, and Michael Cecil.
