

Elius Lamour came into this world on November 11,1932 in the Dominican Republic. He later returned to his parents' native Country of Haiti, settling in Troudu-Nord where he went to primary school.

Early in life, he showed great interest in mastering various skills and pursuits. He was foreman at the largest factory in the Northern part of Haiti and became Union president. In this capacity, he was allowed to have meetings with the nation's President. Often, he would recant a personal advice from President Francois Duvalier: "Fè le mort tande gason m..." Remain quiet you hear, son! His entrepreneurial skills allowed him to transform his ideas and talents into businesses that provided tailoring and shoe repair services and merchandising to a growing local clientele in Haiti.

He migrated to the United States and settled in New York where he lived until his passing. Like many in his generation, he went to work for a Country Club for over 40 years, where he was recognized as an outstanding employee until his retirement in 2013. He was passionate about his family, work and his love for music and dancing.

He married Ella Poulard, whose 2 children he loved as his own biological son Bany Lamour. He had a big heart that charmed and won the affection of many. A gentleman and a fine dancer who commanded attention, he was admired by his sisters and the many other women who would often thirst to be led onto a dance floor by Uncle Elius.

Uncle Elius genuinely found pleasure in others' joy and wellbeing. He knew how to win through kindness, quietness and gentleness. Which niece or nephew does not remember Uncle Elius's generosity? One-of-a-kind giving person, he also extended his heart, and assets to those who were not even his blood relatives. We can still hear his voice telling us "Adje pitit mwen" and making us feel loved.
