# **Obituary**

He had countless friends in Harlem and Esplanade Gardens and touched many lives. He also gave freely of his time and talents as an electrician/ cable installer. Joe loved to entertain and his parties, especially for the Super Bowl and New Year's Eve, were legendary.
