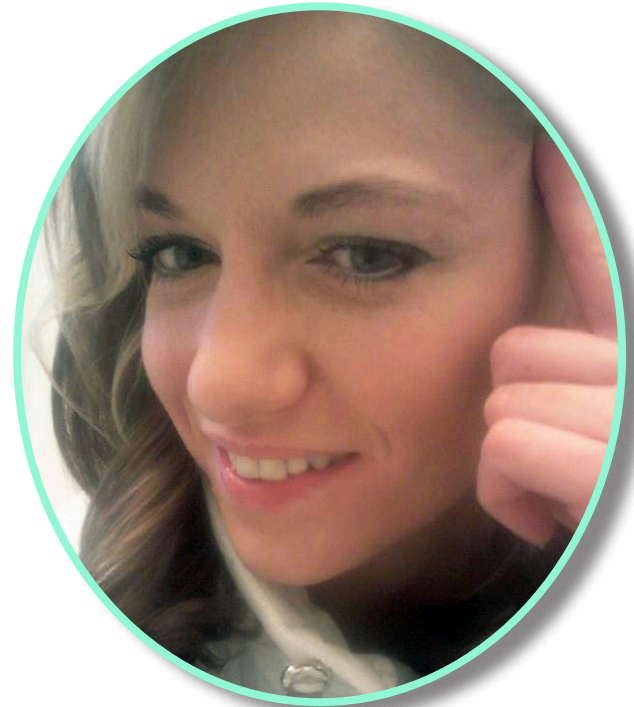

She had a vibrant personality that drew people to her, and she cultivated strong bonds with loved ones both in the United States and in her home country of Poland. Kamila had many passions in life, including traveling, camping, hiking, dancing, reading, learning new things, jazz, and cooking. She found joy in the simple pleasures of life and always sought to bring happiness to others.

She is survived by her husband, James, her parents, Jacek and Halina, her brother, Marcin, and a community of family and friends who will miss her dearly. Kamila is deeply loved, and she will always be a part of us, living within our souls forever.
