

Kyron's first experience with playing organized sports began at age 10 when he played on AAU teams (Team Rock and Gauchos). This allowed him to travel and compete against teams from other cities. Marlo made certain to accompany Kyron and his brother on every trip.

While at Virginia Union, Kyron met the lovely Albani Baker. The two grew inseparable, proving their love and support of each other. Kyron and Albani worked hard to excel and achieve their goals. It was always a pleasure to hear of their next move and accomplishments. They recently purchased a home, added their yorkie, "Zola" to their union and were looking forward to a long life together. Kyron and Albani loved to travel, dine and watch their favorite television shows together (Breaking Bad, Snow Fall and The Sopranos). Watching the entire series of The Wire was an annual event. (It became a MUST!).

Kyron was employed at Vituity Practice Management as an Overboarding Specialist. He had begun to hone his interest in real estate, financial investments and screenwriting. He enjoyed writing scripts and started taking screenwriting courses. He was an ardent basketball and football fan. The Lakers was his favorite team, Kobe Bryant, his favorite player and the Giants (finally, New York) was his favorite football team.

On Saturday, July 23, 2022, while visiting New York City for his family's annual cookout, Kyron's life was tragically taken away from us and he transitioned at Harlem Hospital.
