Obituary

NAJEE BARNES LASSITER was born in Lenox Hill Hospital in Manhattan, New York on August 7, 1998 to the late Bambi Marie Barnes Lassiter (deceased).

Bambi and Najee at the age of 1 ½ years old came to live with Kim Lassiter, who he lovingly called Nana. He was educated in New York City and graduated from Bronx Collegiate Academy on July 1, 2016.

Najee at his young age of life experienced his mother, Bambi, who contracted an ill heart during her pregnancy with Najee, going in and out of hospitals, until she went home to be with the Lord.

On May 27, 2013, Najee at his young age of 14, woke up his Nana due to his heart racing within him. Najee was diagnosed with Wolff-Parkinson-White for 5 years. In 2019, he was re diagnosed with Danon Disease which Nana researched and it attacks young men and if they don't receive a new heart by the age of 19 they expire. Najee was blessed and received a new heart on December 24, 2019 at the age of 21.

During his school years while in High School, Najee had consistent assistance from Ms. Lieberman, the vice-principal. She made sure Najee took the elevator rather than the stairs when he needed to and he rested in her office when he was tired. When illness came upon him she called for an ambulance and called his Nana.

During these years of illness off and on Dr. Eric Silver, the pediatric cardiologist at Columbia Presbyterian Hospital, attended to Najee and due to Najee's heart appearing like an old man's heart, Dr. Silver brought in the adult cardiologist team. When Najee was 21, he was moved to the adult side for heart patients. Nana had Najee moved from Columbia Presbyterian Hospital to NYU Hospital to the Kimmel Pavilion and Dr. Goldberg told Najee he was going to get him a heart. Within 7 weeks Najee received a new heart.

Najee also had the help of his tutor Kennon Landis and Najee received his regents diploma. Prayers were lifted up for Najee through the morning prayer line to receive a full scholarship. Through the prayers lifted up Najee received a full scholarship from Monroe College and through those prayers Najee's entire graduating class received full scholarships also.

Najee lived a life we all will remember for he knew how to live every moment of every day 100%. Najee made a difference in this world and changed his world every place he went. Just as God told Joshua, "Every place that the sole of your foot shall tread upon, that have I given unto you, as I said unto Moses." Najee has touched everyone who has intertwined in his life path and that joy will resinate within each and every one of us in every new moment of our lives and to pass into everyone who intertwines in each of our life paths.

Najee leaves behind Kim Lassiter, which he lovingly called Nana, his great-grandmother MeMe Barnes, Roy Scott, who he called PopPop, one uncle, Justin, 3 aunts, MeMe, Brittany, and Tefa, his cut buddy uncles Cleveland and Aaron, his nurturing aunt-in-law, Alberta, his two special aunties Yolanda (aka YaYa) and Denise, six grand uncles, three grand aunts, and a host of cousins and friends.
