SHEILA VERONICA NICHOLSON ANDRADE,, was born to Lionel Nicholson and Nina Harrison on April 6, 1940, in Spanish Town, Jamaica, West Indies. She was a loving mother and devoted grandmother, a businesswoman and entrepreneur, and a caregiver for not only to her family and extended family but to those in need. Sheila also loved art, traveling and fashion. And make no mistake about it, she worked hard, sought the best of the best, was fiercely independent and did not hold her tongue. Her life journey was lived to the fullest; leaving an indelible legacy from Jamaica (29 yrs.) to New York (17 yrs.) to Florida (37 yrs.), and then returning to New York in April 2023 for her final chapter.

Sheila learned the importance of family, of creating and maintaining connections, and of helping others from her paternal grandmother Susan Glegg Nicholson, whom she affectionately called "Mama." Mama raised Sheila and her three cousins, Joseph and Dudley HooKong and Nadra Barr Moses-Mattis, as if they were her own children. The family was well known in the community and Sheila had a wonderful childhood. Mama held legendary Sunday dinners where folks gathered to share the week's events, stories and experiences, and she tasked Sheila and her cousins with delivering food to friends and neighbors who could not attend. After graduating from Saint Jacobs High School, Sheila remained in Spanish town for a few years where she eventually gave birth to her doting son, Wayne Dewar.

On March 12, 1966, Sheila married Earle Musgrave Andrade, gave birth to her daughter Lori Andrade, and then emigrated to the United States in 1969 to make a new life for her, Wayne and Lori. She became a US citizen in 1974 and, ever fearless, started her first entrepreneurial endeavor – Baby Sitting Service of Queens - connecting mothers in New York with potential caregivers.

Sheila was a force of nature with boundless energy. In 1986, she moved to Florida with her stepmother Hyacinth Nicholson and successfully managed Neurosurgery practices – first for Dr. Arnold Lang and then for Dr. Guillermo Pasarin (her "adopted" son). Outside of her day job, she owned and operated Café Monet and Elegante Baskets while pursuing her passions of ballroom dancing, being a member of a women's choir and tending to her orchids. She retired less than a year ago in December 2022. Throughout her life, Sheila was always encouraging and made everyone around her better. She stayed connected to loved ones, and her home was always open to family members touching down in New York or Florida, needing a place to stay.

Wayne and Lori lovingly shared their Mother with so many, as there was nothing she would not do or offer of herself.

On October 25, 2023, Sheila passed away suddenly at the age of 83. Sheila leaves to cherish her memory: her daughter Lori Andrade; her sisters Suzanne Nicholson, Charmaine Nicholson and brother Lincoln Nicholson; her grandchildren Tiffany Dewar and Randall Hammonds; her daughter-in-law Linda Dewar; and many loving aunts, uncles, cousins, in-laws, extended family and friends. Her father Lionel Nicholson, mother Nina Harrison, and son Wayne Dewar preceded Sheila in death.

Sheila was a beautiful soul and a free spirit, and will be deeply missed.
