Susan Valerie Lee was born on Tuesday, December 17, 1963 to the late Ernestine (Green) Lee and George Lee.

Her elementary schooling began at St. Joseph's Montessori School in Mount Vernon, NY and at the age of 12, Susan entered the Academy of Mt. St. Ursula in the Bronx. An honor student during her four years of high school, Susan entered Barnard College at the age of 16, and graduated in 1984 with a bachelor's degree in psychology. Later, she earned a master's degree in developmental psychology from Teachers College of Columbia University.

As an undergraduate student, Susan began working in the Financial Aid office at Barnard, and she never left. After earning her bachelor's degree, she began working there full-time and progressed for 28 years, retiring in 2012 as the department's Associate Director. In those roles, Susan certainly used her excellent listening skills and displayed her selfless consideration of others. After retirement, Susan actively volunteered her time with a number of causes, including New York Cares and Swing Left. She was also a ceramicist, and created many beautiful pieces as a member of the Mugi Pottery Studio in Manhattan.

A lover of diverse cultures, cuisine and languages, Susan traveled to many national and international destinations. She was an avid reader and maintained a large personal library of books by African-American authors.

Her parents' only child, Susan is survived by the love of her life, her daughter, Nicole Brezina Elizabeth Hines; an uncle, Frank Lee; an aunt, Gwen Blackwell; a host of cousins, including Clarissa Barksdale, The Rev.
